St Anne's House: The contracts for the House of St Anne at St Edmund's have been finalised and the staff of Salford Property Link have begun the process of contacting potential residents. The hope/plan is that people from Salford who would otherwise be homeless and possibly living on the streets will be housed and supported at St Anne's as part of the process of building a more stable way of life and permanent housing. The house will be managed by Salford but our parish commitment is to keep the residents in our prayer and to welcome them as part of the community – No one is beyond reach!

Sacramental Programme: Congratulations to the young people who recently received the Sacrament of Confirmation. These have been difficult times and some Year 8s might have missed the opportunity this time round. There will be 'catch-ups' later; Sr Anna and the parish team will endeavour to enable the programme to build momentum, beginning again with our Year 6 pupils before they move to High School - the journey of faith is a never-ending invitation.

Our series of First Communion Masses have begun albeit with only limited numbers present. These are important stepping stones for our children and for the parish as we welcome them to the table of the Lord. We hope they will continue their journey of faith each week at Sunday Mass.
