Along with this newsletter, we have a very thought-provoking document from Caritas which asks us all to take responsibility for caring for refugees escaping from the terrifying trauma in their country of birth. As you read the information from Caritas, you might be inspired to think of some way that we as individuals or as a parish could respond to these tragic events - writing to our MP and to the Home Secretary, possibly using the letter template, is one way of prompting action - without simply 'pointing the finger of blame'

Laudato Si: Thank you to Dr Gardner who shared some of the insights of Pope Francis' document with us, and challenged us to respond in very practical ways in our own lives
