## Greetings

Prayers: I have had several emails from Uganda concerning the pandemic, including one from Fr Joseph Birigwa: 'Here in Uganda, we struggling with the outbreak of Covid. Right now, we are in a lock down. All schools from primary to University are closed and Churches too. We are facing a second wave of the outbreak of Covid. Many people have died and others are in the hospitals. The situation is not good here and it has affected our economy because people cannot work. They have tried to vaccinate people but only 1.1 million have so far been vaccinated out of 45 million people in Uganda.' They are not alone – across the world, huge numbers of people are struggling with Covid and so much more – Let us pray Laudato Si: Bishop John will lead a short service at the Cathedral this Friday at 1.30pm to begin this year's Season of Creation. We will have our own service on Sunday 19 September – CAFOD petition cards should be sent before 6 October Scouts: the Scouts and Cubs who meet at Christ the King are hoping to have a re-launch on Saturday 11 September; parents, young people and parishioners will be invited – more news next week

**August Bank Holiday Mass** in St. Mary's Cemetery, Wardley, will **not** be taking place this year, due to the continuation of Covid-19 restrictions, although it is now open for private prayer – subject to social distancing of course
